



# Federal Education Funding for FY2011

This chart highlights funding levels for select education programs. The comparison includes the Administration’s budget request to Congress for Fiscal Year 2011 vs. FY2010 appropriations, as well as earlier actions by the House and Senate Appropriations Committees for FY2011. Applicable funding provided for some programs through the *American Recovery & Reinvestment Act* (ARRA) that may be available until September 30, 2011, is also listed.

This chart reflects congressional action on FY2011 appropriations as of December 16, 2010. At the time this chart was posted, members of Congress were considering the option of passing either a consolidated appropriations bill for FY2011 with some increases to key programs, or a year-long continuing resolution that would continue providing the same level of funding for education programs as FY2010.

<sup>2</sup> Temporary funding provided by the *American Recovery & Reinvestment Act* (ARRA) is being awarded during Fiscal Years 2009 and 2010. Funding remains available for some programs through September 30, 2011. Please refer to specific program guidance from the U.S. Department of Education to determine when ARRA funding for certain programs must be obligated for use. <sup>3</sup> Proposed funding allocations for some programs were embargoed by the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Labor, Health & Human Services, and Education, and were not scheduled for release until the full Committee report was final. However, recent developments regarding FY2011 consolidated appropriations have preempted the Committee report.

<sup>4</sup> The Early Learning Challenge Fund (ELCF) would be a new program. ELCF proposals were introduced in earlier legislation with the goal of increasing access to high quality early learning systems for children birth to age 5 to support school readiness.

<sup>5</sup> Program was proposed as part of a restructured “College Pathways and Accelerated Learning” and “Title I College- and Career-Ready Students and Turnaround Grants,” programs under the President’s budget request that was developed under the basis that the Elementary & Secondary Education Act would be reauthorized. However, the House and Senate Appropriations Committees’ actions are based on programs enacted under current laws (e.g. *No Child Left Behind Act*, *American Recovery & Reinvestment Act*, and *FY 2010 Consolidated Appropriations Act*).

<sup>7</sup> Pursuant to the Administration's budget request in FY2010, the Safe & Drug-Free Schools and Communities program was restructured, eliminating funding for state formula grants (\$294.7 million), while increasing national programs funding. Under this restructuring, grants are to be available through a national activities program for "Safe Schools & Citizenship Education."

<sup>8</sup> Budget request includes consolidation of approximately \$103 million from Tech Prep education state grants for partnerships.
