



Fiscal Year 2011 Appropriations for Education Programs

(as of March 9, 2011)

This chart highlights federal funding for select education programs. FY2011 funding allocations remain in effect until March 18, under a Continuing Resolution that was enacted in lieu of a final FY2011 appropriations bill. The chart also lists proposed funding levels from pending legislation—the House-passed FY2011 consolidated appropriations bill (H.R. 1) and the Senate alternative (Amendment No. 149).
