

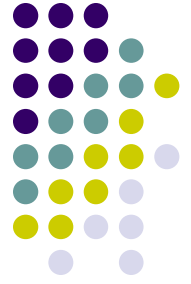

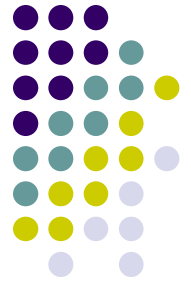

- Eighth largest urban district in nation



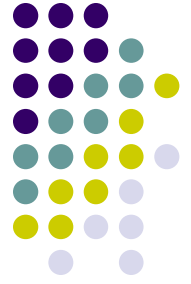
San Diego Unified School District - Enrollment Sept. 08



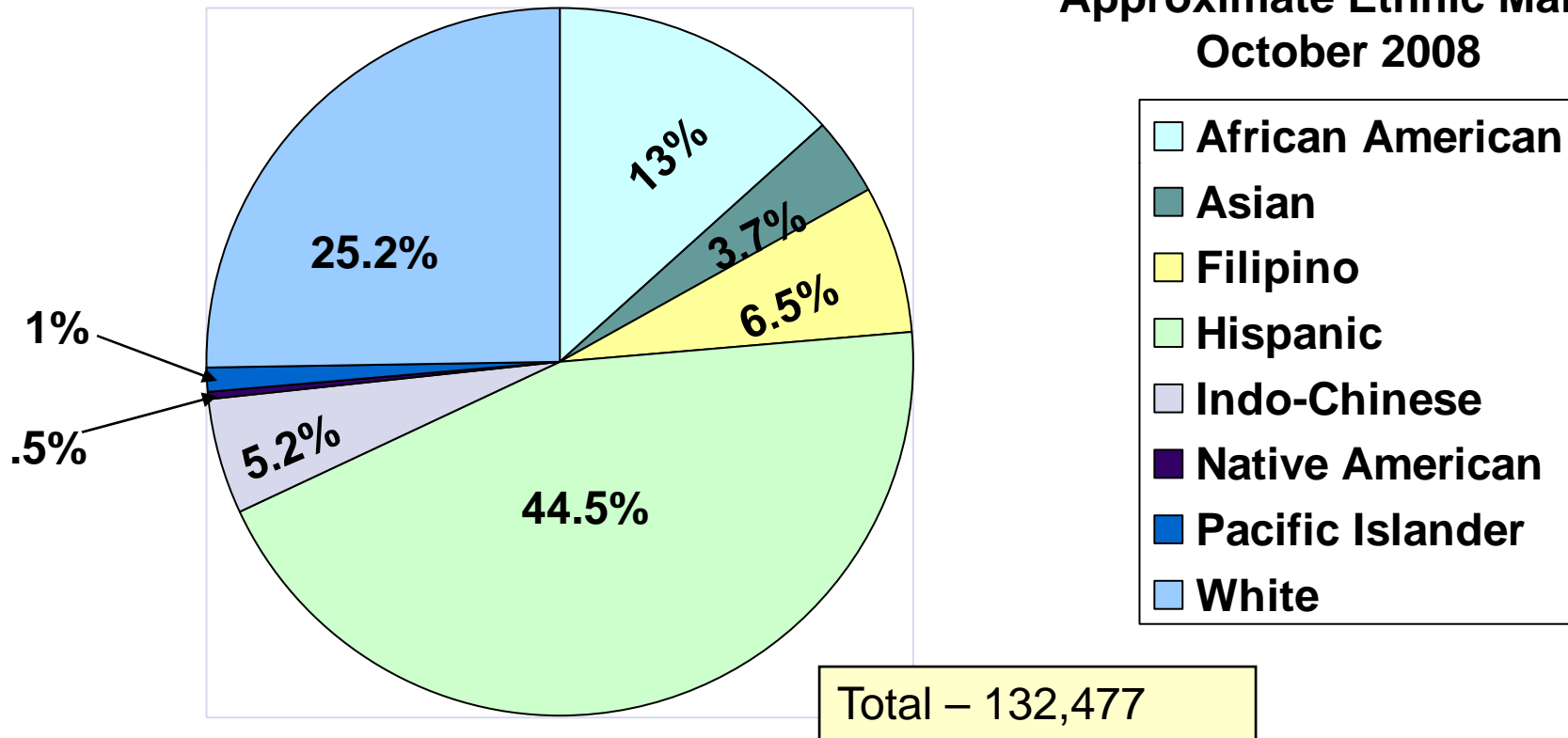

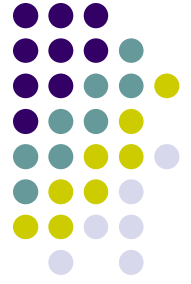


Approximate Ethnic Makeup

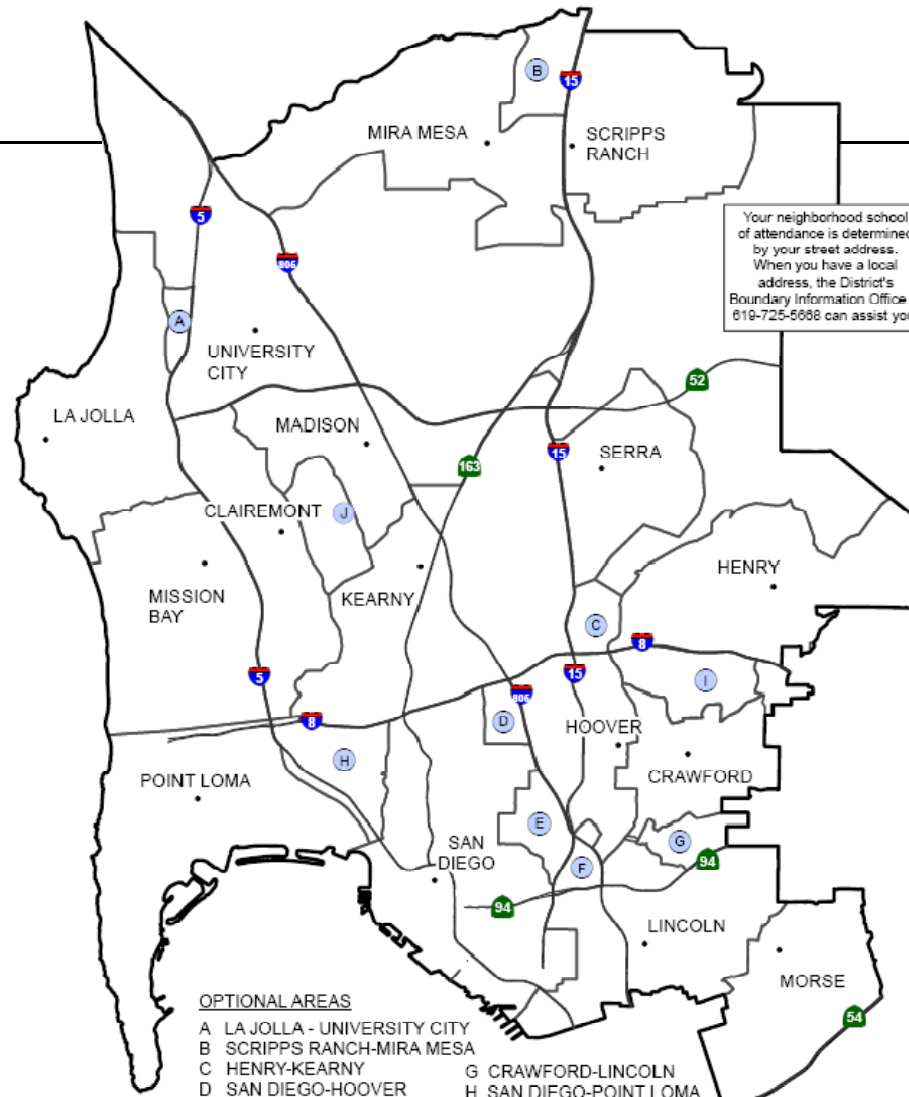
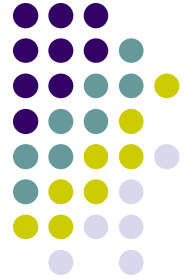

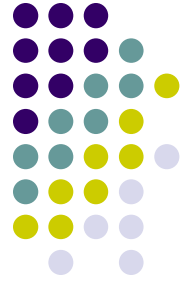

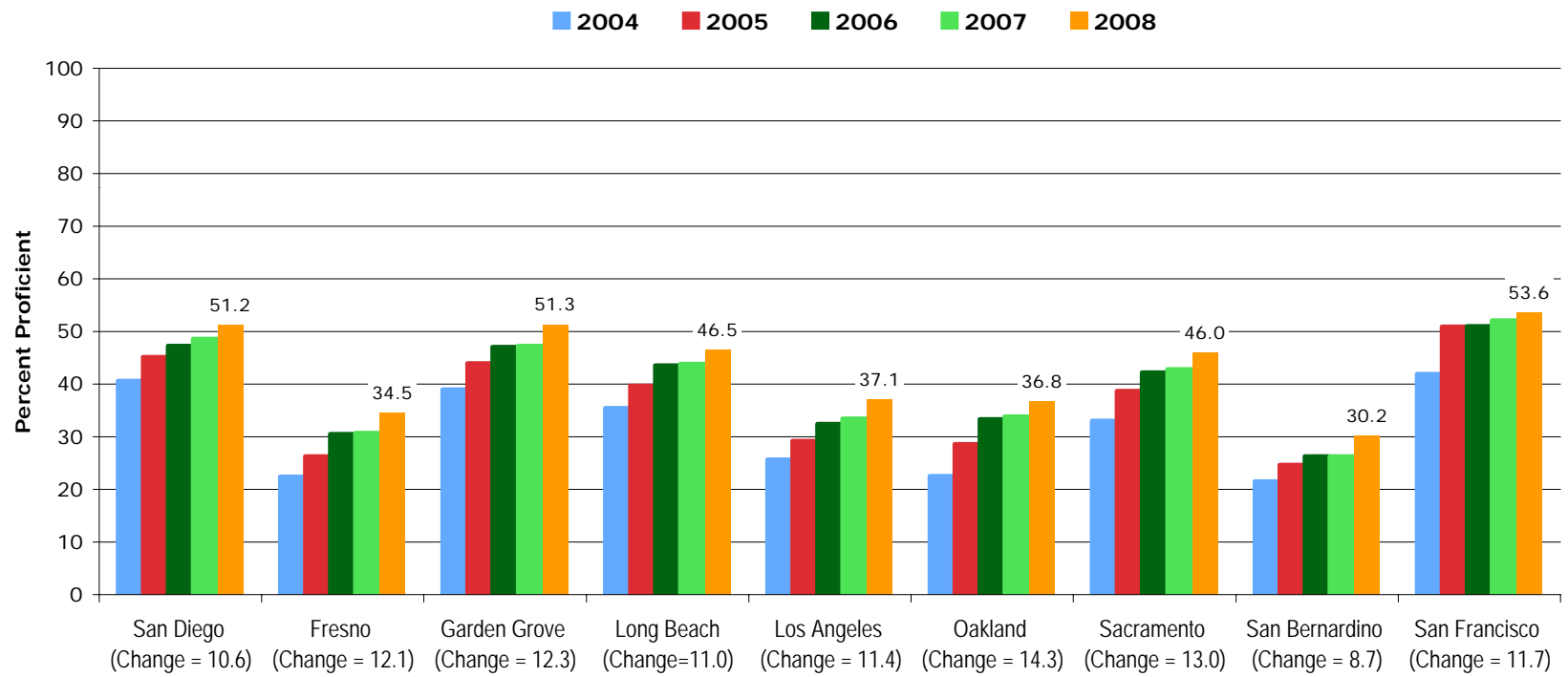

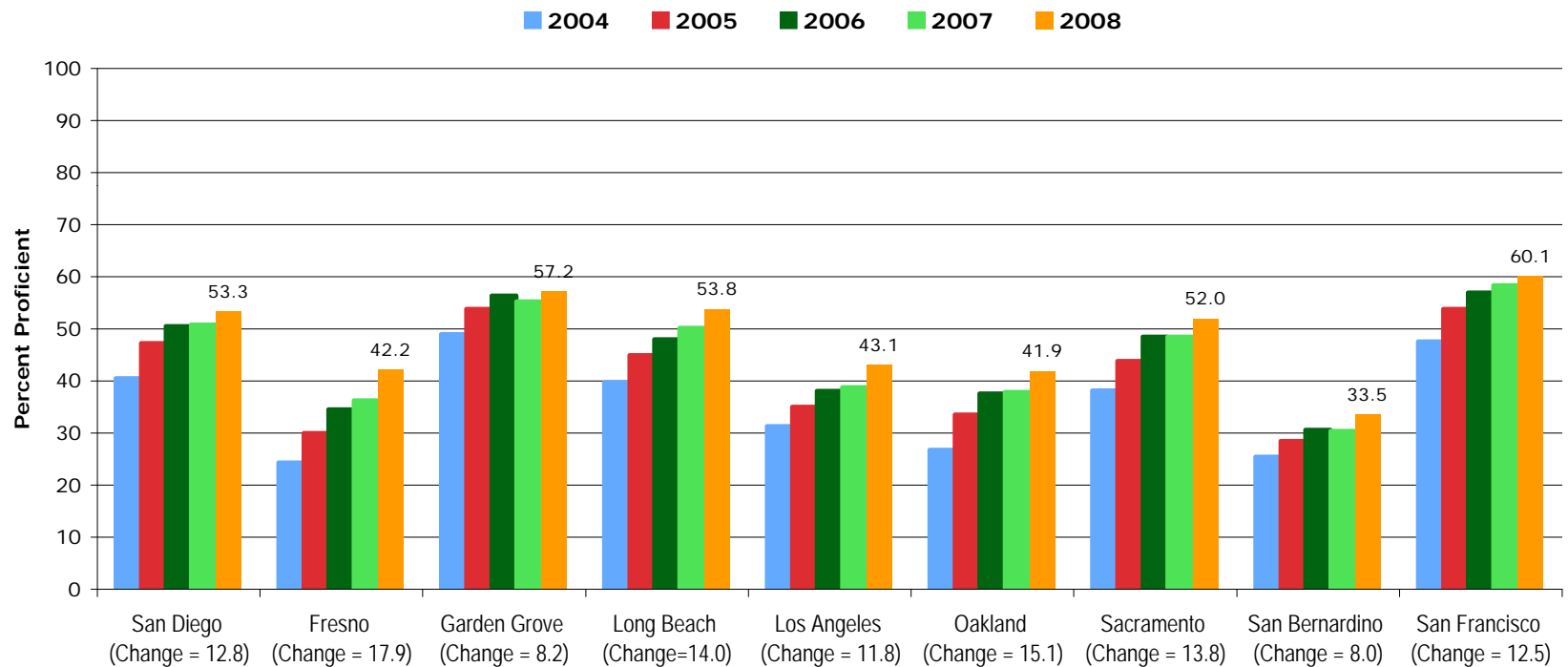
CA Large Urban Districts

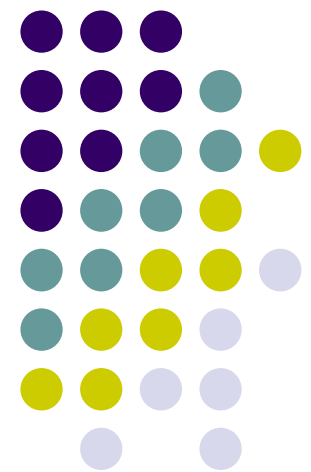

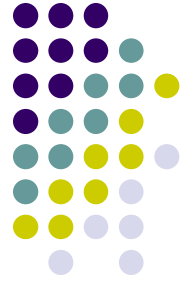

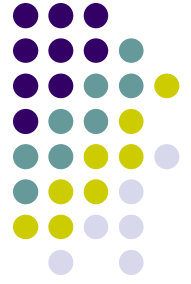
Morse High School

 - 127 classrooms – 87 permanent, 43 portable

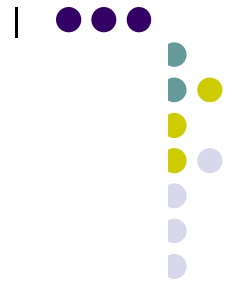
- ❖ Located in the Gompers Park area, surrounded by modest single family homes. The neighborhood is stable and diverse.
